SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...interested in how this operates, how this operates generally, because it doesn't appear to give the landowner any recourse or any right to a hearing, nor does it seem to depend upon scientific information but rather the municipal well supplier simply files his notice of intent, and depending on what the NRD rules are, that's it. Is that how that is intended to operate?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Yeah, that's correct, and 1,000 feet is not a long distance, Senator Beutler. I would remind you that's less than a quarter of a mile.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. It says 1,000 feet or whatever the NRD says.

SENATOR SCHROCK: That's true.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, and you're relying on the fact that the NRD, given its political structure, will be fair to all parties involved?

SENATOR SCHROCK: We hope so.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. It seems like one...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...more reason for one person, one vote, Senator, almost.

SENATOR SCHROCK: By the way, the NRD out in the...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time is up, Senators.

SENATOR SCHROCK: ...out in that NRD is one person, one vote.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, thank you.
