

TRANSCRIPT PREPARED BY THE CLERK OF THE LEGISLATURE
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FLOOR DEBATE

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Veterans Vice Chairman, you're recognized to open on the confirmation report.

SENATOR SMITH: Thank you, Mr. President and members. I rise in support of the confirmation of Ms. Jeanne Ross to the State Personnel Board. She appeared before the committee on the 26th, and we advanced her confirmation unanimously by those members present. And Ms. Ross is a founder, one...a cofounder, I should say, of Curtis and Associates, out of Kearney. It's become a national firm that has since sold. But an entrepreneur in many senses, and knows well the personnel issues associated with government, and outside of government as well. A graduate of UNK, with some good experience in the press and otherwise. And I urge the body's confirmation of Ms. Jeanne Ross. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Smith. You've heard the opening on the confirmation report offered by Senator Smith, Vice Chairman of the Government, Military and Veterans Affairs Committee.
