There's room for some additional improvement in the process, and I will continue to work to get that. In this particular case, I think there are reasons for dividing out the two confirmations and only approving the one--that's been gone over--until we get additional information and know specifically more details, although we do know that there were water violations that caused...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR PREISTER: ...these complaints in one of these appointments. And those water violations this particular environmental compliance officer may not have done. However, that person was in charge of environmental compliance responsibility, and those water violations I think are serious violations that need to be fully investigated. So at this point I support what Senator Schrock is attempting to do in dividing out and separating the two confirmations. One I'm not sure I'm going to vote on, just because I'm still concerned about the process. The other we won't be dealing with today.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR PREISTER: Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Preister. Senator Chambers, on the confirmation report.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, when I made the motion, which turned out to be successful, that we reconsider the confirmation of Ms. McDowell, I said that I was not making any allegations or accusations by that motion. And I meant it at the time. As I read a...the comments attributed to her in the paper, I saw a certain deviousness. She did not say, based on what I read in the paper, that she didn't know about the violations. She says she didn't know about the investigation. That, to me, is a careful parsing of words. If she worked at that plant and she was the compliance...let me ask, before I go on, a question or two to Senator Schrock.
