going on in here; the media does too. We're dealing with that right now. And I think, Senator Chambers, you can respond to that if you'd like, but I have not seen anything to this point that dictates to me, at least from the EPA, that shows that Debra McDowell isn't as qualified as anybody else that we've put on there. My point the other day is, when I was pushing that button 37 times, I depended on the Health and Human Services Committee to do their job. I believe in the Natural Resources Committee. I've been there for two years. I believe in Senator Preister, I believe in Senator Hudkins, Senator Schrock, all of what we've been trying to accomplish. We've been excoriated, I feel like--and maybe I'm just a little bit sensitive--for two days, over something that could happen to anybody on this floor. And it has happened to folks on this floor. It's going to happen again. The point is, let's go ahead and go forward with this. I voted to reconsider her nomination. But guess what? If it comes back up again, I'm voting yes. I'm going to confirm her, and then we're going to take our chances. We're going to roll the dice, if you will. And that's even before the gambling bill comes up. This is frustrating, because I've only been here two years, and I got, supposedly, duped. Who else feels like they got duped? Maybe everybody. But it's not by the Governor. It's by the media, it's by some of our friends, some of our allies, the people that call in, in the morning and in the afternoon and everything else, to complain about what we do. Keep focused on the process, the broken process, if you will. Debra McDowell had served for, what, five months? Somebody help me out with that. Served for five months before we even decided to try to confirm her. That's the process that's messed up. What we're trying to do is fix a process I'm not sure we have any control over right now. That's all I have to say about this. I don't know where to go with it, but the fact of the matter is we're getting pounded for things that we don't have much control over. And I don't know how to fix it. Senator Chambers, you might think you're fixing it right now. I'm not sure you are. You're just wasting time. Maybe I'm just wasting time. Great. Let's keep wasting it, because maybe this is an important enough issue that we can continue on and come to some type of conclusion. Somebody with some institutional knowledge, help us out with that.
