listen to my colleagues, and I heard Senator Louden say that the type of water that is being addressed in this part of the division is not the one of his greatest concern, so there will not be a lot of discussion on his part about this provision. And I want to make something clear also about how I'm approaching this. When the committee amendment or any amendment is divided and one of the divisions is adopted, that division becomes a part of the bill. It is still, at that point, subject to being amended. So what I intend to do is offer the types of amendments that I'm discussing now to the committee amendment, then listen to the debate to determine whether I will vote for the adoption of the committee amendments, then after they are adopted, as I'm sure they will be, any substantive amendments I would offer at that time, because then they would go to the bill, since the committee amendments become the bill. There is too much in these committee amendments for me to attempt to draft careful, appropriate amendments to the areas of the bill that I have questions about. I will be brimming with questions to ask Senator Schrock and others. And some I will present to Senator Beutler. He used to be the head of that committee, so some of these questions he perhaps can answer too. I will ask Senator Jones if he knows anything about it, or whoever.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Because what I am going to need is information. I do not believe we should just say this is only \$2.5 million, and because of the amounts of money that we're going to be dealing with we will not pay too much attention to that. It is the increments of \$2.5 million there...here, \$2.5 million there, here \$2.5 million, there \$2.5 million, everywhere \$2.5 million million, that gets us into the plight we find ourselves confronted with now. But the plight that faces the state now was not of the Legislature's creation. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Chambers, there are no further lights on.
