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an...educated as an attorney, probably understand that more than I do. But when reasonable people who disagree can sit down and talk about each other's point of view, a lot of times they can agree. And I suspect that if we don't...if we have this process--and nonbinding, I think, is also a key--if we have this process, I think it just probably will make it very rare that the Water Review Board will ever be used. Without the process, I think people will probably dig in their heels, and the Water Review Board will have to be used too much.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Schrock, when these types of...first of all, have these types of disputes arisen in the past, that we're discussing trying to resolve through this legislation in this method? Have there...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...been such disputes in the past? Or will they not come into existence until this bill is enacted into law?

SENATOR SCHROCK: State that again, Senator Chambers. I was talking to counsel.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, okay. I'll wait, because I've only got a minute. When I'm recognized, I will ask it again.

SENATOR SCHROCK: All right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Because there is no way I can properly frame the question, or you answer it, it this short a space.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Okay.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Chambers, your light is next.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: It will be your third time, as you know.
