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SENATOR CHAMBERS: Right. Senator Schrock, have these types of disputes arisen in the past, or will they arise only if this bill is enacted into law?

SENATOR SCHROCK: (Microphone malfunction)

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Could we get...?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Senator Chambers,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Sorry about that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR SCHROCK: ...if we don't enact this legislation, I think we're going to have a lot more legal battles. I think we'll have a lot more disputes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, here's my question. Do these types of disputes occur now? And this has nothing to do with whether we ought to enact the law or not. I just want to get to my next question.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Well, there's disputes on Pumpkin Creek, is one that comes to mind, and that is in court. Is that what you're talking about?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, I don't want to name one.

SENATOR SCHROCK: All right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But we do have disputes that will have to be resolved, or we wouldn't even be considering this type of legislation.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Would you agree? All right.

SENATOR SCHROCK: And I think as we go along we're going to see a lot of disputes on water issues. And if we don't have
