SENATOR SCHROCK: I believe that this is the way they would do it. They would use this mediation, and then when that fails they'd go to the Water Review Board. I suppose if both parties said, we're not going to mediate, they could go directly to the Water Review Board. I can't respond 100 percent accuracy on that right now, but I...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Here's what...oh, excuse me. Here's what I see on page 106, in line 7. And I hope you forgive me for departing from my amendment, but it's not...it doesn't need explanation, so I want to use this time. Starting in line 7: "the department or district may initiate a nonbinding alternative dispute..."

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: "...resolution process by submitting"...and then going on from there.

SENATOR SCHROCK: It is "may."

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now...oh, and then in line 10, the process shall be initiated by the department if agreement on the proposed management plan has not been reached before this 170 (sic) days. So they either...I guess the "may" is letting us know that either one can initiate it. But if they haven't reached an agreement before 270 days from the deadline, then there must be the utilization of this alternative process. I think that's what it's saying. But once it is in place, nobody is bound by anything that it does. And that's why I'm getting stuck on this point. Is my time up, Mr. President? Oh, that was Senator Schrock's time, wasn't it?

SENATOR CUDABACK: It is Senator Schrock...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, I'm sorry, Senator Schrock.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Well, Senator Chambers, if...

SENATOR CUDABACK: And, Senator Schrock, we...your time is up also. But your light is next, so you may continue.
