SENATOR SCHROCK: Okay. Senator Chambers, my time now. But I'll let you...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So was that. That was your time.

SENATOR SCHROCK: ...participate. But if the mediation was binding, then you wouldn't need the Water Review Board.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Right.

SENATOR SCHROCK: And I don't think the parties out there would want to go that route. They would want the Water Review Board as a last resort. And so...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, so we get to the Water Review Board. They're there anyway.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: They just wasted a lot of time. How much time do they have to engage in mediation, if...or is there a time...?

SENATOR SCHROCK: It's 270 days, was it not?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That's what it seems to me, because entering this process apparently does not move the deadline further down the line. You have to do it within that 270 days.

SENATOR SCHROCK: That's...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I think that's the way I read it too.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Okay. I would agree.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So after the 270 days they then go to the Water Review Board. And that brings us to this board, where I have a problem because of the makeup, and the fact the Governor would be a voting member. So something else I hope you will think about--I'm not trying to bind you to anything now, I'm
