letter (a). Then in line 12, before the word "potential" as it appears now, but it will be "reduction" with the amendment that was adopted, I would insert the lowercase letter (b). On line 12 still, before the word "reservation," I would insert the lowercase letter (c). Then in line 13, before the word "provision," I would insert the letter (d), as in David. In line 14, before the word "preservation," I would insert the letter (e), as in Ernie. In line 15, before the word "protection," I would insert the letter (f). In line 16, before the letter...before the word "provision," I would insert (g), as in go. In line 17, before the word "provision," I would insert (h). In line 19, before "conservation," I would insert the letter (i). Still in line 19, before the word "protection," I would insert (j). And it would read the following way, and I think these divisions are correct. The reason I wanted to do this is because, as I read it and you look at the placement of commas, it is not always clear that the comma sets off all of the words which precede it in a unit or, if there is a unit that has several commas within it, to set off various portions of what that unit would be. So by putting a letter before each of the units, if there are commas within that unit, it will be clear that the items separated are nevertheless part of that unit. So in the first division or unit set aside would be "abatement of pollution"; then under (b) would be "reduction of potential flood damages"; then under (c), "reservation of lands for resource development projects"; under (d), "provision of public irrigation facilities"; under (e), "preservation and development of fish and wildlife resources"; under (f), "protection and improvement of public lands"; under (g), "provision of public outdoor recreation lands and facilities"; under (h), "provision and preservation of the waters of the state for all beneficial uses, including domestic, agricultural, and manufacturing uses." And that is one of those units that has several parts which are set apart by commas. Under (i) would be "conservation of land resources"; under (j) would be "protection of the health, safety, and general welfare of the people." I think this is a good amendment, and I think it is wise to do it in this manner. I stated earlier when I was on another amendment, foreshadowing this one, that other places are found in this bill and throughout the statutes where a long series of items will be set off in this manner.
