letters of the alphabet or you use numerals if you're dealing with subsections. But that's not always the case, because in the statutes sometimes numerals are used where you could use lowercase letters. Sometimes lowercase letters of the alphabet are used to subdivide. This bill before us, as it exists in the subcommittee...in the committee amendments, is a hodgepodge, because the original statutes that are being amended constitute a hodgepodge. This area of the law was not put together as a result of a group of knowledgeable people coming together and compiling all of the statutes that relate to this area and figuring how to harmonize and make them coherent. There was a piecemeal adoption, a piece here, a piece there, not always because that piece was essential to a rational program for the management of the water, but because there was a particular political opportunity that presented itself to allow a step to be taken or a bite to be nibbled from the apple. So if somebody said there should be a management plan for the state's water, some kind of correlation between the use of surface water and ground water, maybe there would be so much opposition that the only way a step could be taken is to say, well, let's put that in the statute, but we won't fund it. In years to come, we will have the opportunity to review this, and then, when we are satisfied that this makes sense, we'll try to get the money. And that's where we are today. Some people are saying, well, there are parts of this that we're discussing already in the statute. And if the money had been given at the time that that language was put in the statute, we wouldn't face the problem we have today. But had an attempt been made to put the money in at that time, the language that is in the law wouldn't be there either. So if we're going to build a house and all 49 of us are going to work on that house and we do not have a common blueprint and each person is assigned something to do, somebody is going to make a door, somebody is going to make a window, and not all the windows, but a window at a certain location on a side of the house, and somebody is going to build...
