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SENATOR SCHROCK: Yes, that's correct.

SENATOR BEUTLER: You're planning on putting this into the trust fund.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Yes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. And as I'm reading how this trust fund would operate, it says: Money in the fund shall not be subject to any fiscal-year limitation or lapse provision of unexpended balance at the end of every (sic) fiscal year or biennium.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Would you continue to...would you be advocating that particular provision also as part of the trust fund?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Yes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: As you know, Senator, the Appropriations Committee currently has the authority to deal with fiscal-year limitations and lapses and to work with this fund as we work with all other different kinds of funds, and in periods of shortages we sometimes take money from these various funds or cut down on the spending, the aid to local political subdivisions or state agencies. So when we get into another period like this, you'd be taking the Water Development Fund, and the Soil and Water Conservation Fund, and the Small Watersheds Flood Control Fund, and saying these funds aren't going to help us out of any fiscal crisis anymore. Is that...is that what you'd be saying?

SENATOR SCHROCK: That's what we'd be saying. But of course,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR SCHROCK: ...remember, this failed in Revenue Committee, that portion of it.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Well, but you're creating...you're
