SENATOR MINES: Okay. I'll ask Senator Schrock that question. The real issue that I had in the bill is the Natural Resources Commission and the director of the Department of Natural Resources, I believe that they would establish the distribution of the funds. The intent from the committee is that 40 percent of the funds would be used for water management needs and 60 percent would be used for another purpose, and that's the intent of the committee. And the distribution is to be set that way, but then the actual distribution is under the direction of the Natural Resources Commission and the director, Department of National (sic) Resources. After ten years, that goes away and its full discretion, as far as distribution by those two, by that director and that agency. Did you happen to see that in the bill?

SENATOR BEUTLER: I missed that provision, Senator,...

SENATOR MINES: Okay.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...if there's a ten-year provision in there.

SENATOR MINES: Okay. Well, I think ultimately, from a...it would make some sense if appropriations were through the correct channels as opposed to a separate, stand-alone agency, that...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR MINES: ...eventually may or may not be held accountable. And that...I just wanted to ask you that. Could I have Senator Schrock yield, Mr. President?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Schrock, will you yield?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Yes.

SENATOR MINES: Thank you, Senator Schrock. My question to Senator Beutler before was about the management aspect of the bill. Will it include both surface water as well as ground water?
