SENATOR BEUTLER: ...and domestic?

SENATOR CUDABACK: You're on Senator Wehrbein's.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Senator Wehrbein, the fairy godfather, we're on his time.

SENATOR CUDABACK: I'm sorry. Senator Schrock.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Let me read you the rest of it, Senator Schrock. Do we have more time, Senator Cudaback?

SENATOR CUDABACK: You have about two and a half minutes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: And then you can get the full flavor of what he's saying here. The task force proposals require overly-burdensome conditions upon temporary transfers to the domestic preference, temporary transfers to the domestic preference.
