Mr. President, I do have another amendment. Senator Chambers would move to amend this component of the committee amendments. (FA1521, Legislative Journal page 865.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers, to open on your amendment to FA1502.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, can...Mr. Clerk, could you read this particular amendment, so that I will get coordinated with what I have on my desk?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Senator, on page 4, in lines 7 and 8,...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'm okay now.

CLERK: Okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. I had to get the right one. Members of the Legislature, in case this is not on your gadget, I will read you what this amendment would do. As the Clerk started to read, the amendment is found on page 4. In lines 7 and 8, I would strike the words: provided by the owners of an appropriation. I'm going to tell you first which words are being stricken and so forth, and then I will explain what the significance is. So on page 4, in lines 7 and 8, strike the words "provided by the owner of an appropriation or otherwise" and insert ", however." Then in line 9, before "preliminary," insert the word "a," or the article "a," and strike "determinations" and insert "determination," singular. The reason I think the language should be stricken on lines 7 and 8 can be explained if I read the sentence of which those words are a part. Beginning in line 6: "If, based upon the results of a field investigation or upon information provided by the owner of an appropriation or otherwise obtained." I would strike the words "provided by the owner of an appropriation or otherwise." And the sentence would read, "If, based upon the results of a field investigation or upon information, however obtained."
