SENATOR SCHIMEK: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...Senator Mines, and there can be no discussion of that. Senator Chambers has had a number of amendments. But as you well know, they're small things related to the first provision of the bill. So I...if this bill doesn't go anywhere, or it's pulled, or whatever happens to it, I'm not feeling that I should take any blame for it. I think that any task force that brings anything into this Legislature should expect that the individual legislators in here are going to represent what they believe their constituency would say, and act accordingly. And I think that's what you would expect to do if it were some urban matter that came in here with a task force and had its idea about what should be done. So...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Time. Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Chambers, your light is on next.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, members of the Legislature, I have offered a substitute to what is up there now. And what will be left is the first part of the amendment. It would say, on page 4, in lines 7 and 8, strike "provided by the owner of an appropriation or otherwise" and insert the word "however." The remainder of that will not be a part of the amendment. So that's what I'm requesting permission from the compassionate, accommodating Chair to do, if she will grant me that boon.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Senator Chambers, you are withdrawing your amendment and substituting FA1522. Is that correct? (FA1522, Legislative Journal pages 865-866.)
