Legislature. The Education Committee recommends to you the confirmation of Stan Carpenter to be a member of the Nebraska Educational Telecommunications Commission. The commission is composed of 11 members. One of those is a representative of the state colleges. Stan has served as the executive director of the Nebraska State College System since the year 2000. He received his law degree from Northern Kentucky University, in addition to a master's degree in education, and a bachelor of science degree from the University of Cincinnati. Also, in other testimony before the Education Committee, he's discussed his high school career and has pointed out that he was in the half of his high school class that made the top half possible. His appointment extends from September 9, 2003, through January 1, 2005. Again, the Education Committee recommends confirmation of this appointment. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Chairman Raikes. You've heard the opening of the confirmation report offered by the Education Committee. Open for discussion on that report.
