the...some of the issues that we need to do. You probably read about the philosophical discussions we're having in our committee. We're still looking at options, but I will expect that it will come together fairly rapidly once we get down to having to make the decision. But an extra couple days here would be very helpful and that's the reason for the suspension request.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. You've heard the opening on the motion to suspend Rule 8, Section 5. Open for discussion on that motion. Senator Bromm. I'm sorry. Senator Smith, your light was first. Did you wish to yield? Senator Bromm.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Mr. President. I rise to support Senator Wehrbein's request and motion. I am looking at the information that the committee has had to deal with on very short notice here since last week's report. I think it is very reasonable to give them an extra two, three days to try to work things out and bring a product to the floor that they feel, at least, they've had ample time to deal with it. So it will make better use of floor time and I think result in a better discussion on the floor if we suspend this aspect of the rules. And so I would certainly encourage the body to allow that and support that.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bromm. Senator Smith, did you wish to...? He waives his opportunity to speak. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I am the only one on the floor who votes against adopting the rules at the beginning of the session. That is a pledge by me, although unspoken, that it is my intent, even though I do not support the rules that are adopted, to stay within the rules no matter what I do. I have often stated, when my colleagues are trying to change the rules to silence me or cripple me, that the rules will bite them before they bite me. I have not made a motion to suspend the rules because I've been so brainwashed in the white schools that I attended and being around white people all my life that rules are for a purpose, that rules are to be
