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at any rate, what I wrote was exactly what I meant, and I'm going to read the letter on the floor, because I want it a matter of record and I want the Attorney General to be aware of it; that if he tears up the letter, he's not going to get away from it and that will not ensure that nobody else will see it.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH: Thank you, Mr. President and members. I believe that this discussion we're having this morning is relevant. I think the vote to suspend the rules is also relevant. We heard the Speaker say that for the sake of moving the session along that the suspension of the rules is relevant and is appropriate and encouraged. And I hope that we as a body understand that this vote certainly does establish somewhat of a precedent, but not a huge one, because it's been done before. And I hope that the body understands that this is an option for moving the session along for other reasons as well. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Smith. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, being a man of my word, I shall read. But I do need a bit of help from my "spectacleez." I mean spectacles. I'm sorry. You know, when you read those names of people from the old days, the c-l-e was always pronounced like an l-e, you know, "cle," Pericles. Dear Mr. Attorney General...and, by the way, there is a copy attached of an article that was on the front page of the morning World-Herald. It shows you-all's Attorney General sitting beside a lady named Maggie Gallagher of the Institute for Marriage and Public Policy. Dear Mr. Attorney General: In view of the fact that you have the leisure and your budget contains enough fat to permit you to travel to Washington, D.C., to advance an extremist, radical, discriminatory political agenda, I am relieved of any need to support additional funding to your office. I appreciate your making this fact known prior to the Legislature's budget battles, which will be intense. Any
