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important too. A lot of people was bringing up about the fees. And I understand if this bill does not have no money to go with it, it's going to be tough to even decide how overappropriated some of these basins are, because they don't have the technology and the work to do it. So we do have to have some fees. Whether we have as much as they want is something else. And I think that maybe they can get by with less, and at least have a jump start on it and decide what they're going to do. But my district just sits pretty well right over the Ogallala Aquifer, where it starts up there. And I have a lot of the streams starting in my district and coming down this way. And like it's been said earlier, water runs east. And I can remember the last two summers there was no water in the Platte River above Columbus. And still the big well fields for Lincoln here was pumping at Ashland. And that water that was supplying them was coming directly from the Sandhills. And so we got streams up there that has flowed steady since I've been there. I've got the South Loup River right by my place, and I don't think it's fluctuated over an inch or two ever since I've been there, last 40 years. Even in the drought two years ago it didn't fluctuate. So the spring waters are stable, and we're real fortunate to have this Ogallala Aquifer and all the springs we have that are carrying off the excess water off the Sandhills, because at one time, I understood, it was a desert. And at the time it got filled up, it takes all these streams running 24 hours a day just to carry off the excess. And I think we should have had more dams built up the line years ago, but we don't, so we're going to have to put up with what we got. And I don't think we'd even be talking about this bill too much if we hadn't had two or three years right in a row of a drought. And I think that's really serious in our area. And if we don't get a lot of rain above McConaughy and get it soon, there's going to be a lot of people cut off. Even around the Hershey and where my wife come, they say that there's not going to be no water coming down that ditch much, and she can't remember when that ever happened before. And that's directly because of the no water in McConaughy. And then we hear where Gerald Gentleman is going to have to drill 40 wells just to cool the water to cool the turbans, because the water that's coming out of McConaughy is too warm because it's too low. So there's a serious water problem. But...and far as the fees to fund it, I think that
