SENATOR SCHROCK: Mr. President, members of the body, I think I support Senator Chambers' amendment. I am looking for a little direction from counsel. Give us a minute and we'll know for sure, how does that sound?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Schrock. Senator Chambers, there are no other lights on. Did you wish to close? You may speak.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, whenever any of these amendments that I offer raise any issue, I want there to be an opportunity to address whatever issue is raised. So rather than close while Senator Schrock may have a question, I'm going to speak in order to give him and his counsel the opportunity to review the amendment and see whether or not there is any problem with it. And I'm sure if there is a question about it, I can answer it to their satisfaction and they will then agree with this amendment. I will discuss the portion that might be raising a question. In line 7, I would strike the word "agreeing" as being superfluous. When the language is read without that word, it will be clear that we're referring to owners who have entered an agreement. So there is no need to modify owner or owners with the word "agreeing." I'm not sure what else could raise a problem, so I will await further commentary from Senator Schrock. Senator Schrock is on a quest, so I will continue to speak until he has the opportunity to complete his search. Maybe I could talk briefly about the next amendment that I will be offering, and I think I may have sent it up to the desk, but I want to be sure so that I do not speak out of turn. Let me tell you about it anyway. I'm sure you'll find it very interesting and engaging. We will skip page 7, which means I didn't find anything worthy of modifying on that page and wind up on page 8. But you're just going to have to hang in suspense until I get to that amendment because I see that Senator Schrock has returned to his desk and I will ask him a question.
