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FLOOR DEBATE

March 4, 2004            LB 962

SENATOR CUDABACK:     Senator Chambers has waived his option to close. The question before the body is FA1530 which is an amendment to FA1502 to the first division of the divided committee amendments. All in favor of the motion vote aye, opposed nay. The question before the body is FA1530. We're voting on FA1530 which is an amendment to the first division of the divided committee amendments offered by the Natural Resources Committee to LB 962. Have you all voted who care to? Record please, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK:     25 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of Senator Chambers' amendment, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK:     The motion was successful. FA1530 has been adopted. Mr. Clerk, when you get time, the next motion.

ASSISTANT CLERK:     Mr. President, Senator Chambers would move to amend with FA1531. (Legislative Journal page 882.)

SENATOR CUDABACK:     Senator Chambers, you're recognized to open on FA1531.

SENATOR CHAMBERS:     Thank you. Mr. President, and members of the Legislature, to get right into an explanation, first a description of this amendment. On page 9, still, strike the word "the" which appears before "publication." In line 16, strike the word "Nebraska." In line 18, strike "any Nebraska County which contains." All of those words would be stricken. Then in line 26, we would strike and show as stricken the word "a." Then I would go to page 10...oh, strike the word "a" and insert "each" and I'm going to explain this after I mention it all. On page 10, in line 6, strike the word "one" and insert "person." Then in line 8, strike and show as stricken "someone interested" and insert "an interested person." Now I will explain. In line 9...I mean in line 15, on page 9, that article "the" need not be in front of "publication." This language parallels other such language in the statute, but in the other language what it would be saying is "the publication" which would be followed by the words "of such notice." But we're not putting the "of such notice" behind or following the word
