about to allow us to part from my process of amending on the first division of this question. Here is...I will wait for the applause to die down (laughing).

SENATOR CUDABACK: I'm not sure what it was.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: On page 13, members of the Legislature, you all ought to be glad to witness these last few days. You have seen me work very hard. The amendments may not seem to be that difficult, but when they result from having read carefully all of this bill, then you know that I have suffered much in order to reach the point where we are now. On page 13, in line 12, I would strike the word "dictates" and insert "principles." And since that's the only amendment on this page, I will explain why. The sentence of which this word is a part says: "Circumstances were such that a prudent person, following the dictates of good husbandry." I think it would be more appropriate in a statute to say the "principles of good husbandry." So that's why I'm offering that amendment. Then scampering right over to page 14, I would drop down to line 27 to the word "cancelled" which is offered with a double "l". Earlier in the bill we adopted an amendment to drop one of those l's so that the spelling is consistent throughout the bill and that is what this part of the amendment would do. Then on page 15, line 7, I would strike the word "that" and insert the word "such." This, again, is one of those instances where the language on this line is making reference back to something which preceded it. So rather than say "that appropriation," the language would say "such appropriation." That is the sum total of this amendment. I am asking that you adopt it.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Was that your closing, Senator Chambers?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I didn't hear you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Was that your closing or opening?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That's my opening.

SENATOR CUDABACK: That's your opening. Now open for discussion. There are no lights on, Senator Chambers. Now you
