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And many, many of us, people that aren't...have the wealth to go to other more expensive events, tend to go there. So I'm not going to elaborate a lot on this here. But I just think it's important to get the message out that, hey, we could do a lot worse. We could do a lot worse. Here we're talking about putting gambling in the...is that...of course, I guess gambling is already in the...it says we can't, but we might put that in there to say we can. Would you rather have a casino in Nebraska, or a State Fair? Better not ask that too loud here; I may get...

SENATOR VRTISKA: One minute.

SENATOR CUDABACK: ...shot in the back here. But anyway, you know where I stand, I think. Do I need to say any more? Somebody come up to me awhile ago--now, tell us how you really feel. Maybe I don't need to do that. But everybody has the right to have their opinion. That's the good thing about this. Everybody has an opinion, express it. That's it. Thanks for listening.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. Next speaker is Senator Raikes, speaking on the Landis amendment to the General Affairs amendment on LR 209CA. Senator Raikes.

SENATOR RAIKES: Thank you, Mr. President, members. If I could, I'd like to ask Senator Landis a question about this amendment.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Senator Landis, will you yield?

SENATOR RAIKES: Senator, if you wanted to direct \$2 million to the State Fair perhaps from the lottery proceeds, couldn't you just do it by offering a bill?

SENATOR LANDIS: And Senator Raikes, you don't know the answer to that question? Because I'll be happy to provide it if you're unaware of the answer to that question.

SENATOR RAIKES: Okay, if you would, please.

SENATOR LANDIS: Yes. The answer is, we could do that.
