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\$2 million alone is not enough, I think it is a key ingredient to giving us a chance to make it work. And if, in fact, the public doesn't believe it, they vote it down. And if, in fact, it's not enough, then this money, under the terms of the very amendment...

SENATOR VRTISKA: One minute.

SENATOR LANDIS: ...that we're talking about, goes to the General Fund. Now, Senator Chambers' argument is unique, and deserves some attention, but I think I was just told one minute. So I'll renew my light and see if I can take up the question of the sanctity of the State Constitution in another speech.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Thank you, Senator Landis. Senator Chambers. Senator Chambers, on your priority motion to bracket. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I will close briefly. Then I'm going to pull that...this is my time to close, is that right? Or it's just to speak? Oh, then I will pass.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Foley, on the LR 209CA.

SENATOR FOLEY: Thank you, Mr. President, members. Senator Chambers has told us a couple of times he's going to pull this bracket motion, so I won't speak to the bracket, but I will speak to the underlying proposal. You know, as a senator who represents a Lincoln district, I suppose I ought to be wildly enthusiastic about something that will bring \$2 million into the community that I represent. And I suppose as a father of six children I ought to be wildly enthusiastic about trying to save the State Fair. But the reality is, I'm not. I've been to the State Fair. My family and I have been there. And it was fine. But we've got to face the truth. And the truth is there are so many other things that families can do today with their time and with their entertainment dollar other than the State Fair. Not that we wouldn't go to the State Fair again, we might go there again someday. But there are so many other things we can do. Senator Thompson reminded us a couple of times in her speeches
