Committee. I said, what are we paying the \$500,000 for? And the answer was, it's for prize money for the contestants. So it dawned on me that the State Fair was not even providing sufficient income to itself to provide for the prizes for the contestants at the State Fair. And then it...then I thought, exactly what is the State Fair? And I'm not sure all of us on the floor here know what the State Fair is. But the State Fair is a private organization. It's not a state agency. And two years ago, in 2002, I filed LB 961, which was to make it a state agency, saying, if we're going to be getting state money into this, the state ought to have an involvement. The state does not have an involvement, and it should have an involvement if we were going to make that decision. But what happened was, instead of making it a state agency, the board was reconstructed. They had a board that had been commanders of the Titanic for a period of time, and they managed to lose the Husker Harvest Days to Grand Island, they managed to lose the Lancaster Fair to the Lancaster Event Center. And part of the problem was, it was partitioning out their potential customers to come to the State Fair. So the numbers of admissions had been going down, and they were going down because there was no reason to be going to the State Fair. Some of the primary reasons why people went to the fair had to do with the events of the Husker Harvest Days, had to do with the Lancaster Fair event. But it was just a diminishing opportunity for people. Now I would describe the State Fair as an event looking for a purpose. And I think what's happened is now they're trying to say, okay, what do we need to do to attract people to come to the State Fair? Well, I think the biggest thing the State Fair has going for it right now is nostalgia, and I don't think that's an adequate amount of concern that we should have that we should begin to amend our constitution to guarantee to the State Fair a fund of money to operate. We don't even give that to the Environmental Trust. We don't give it to the Educational Innovation Fund, and we have direct control with those. These are entities. But the other thing that bothered me when I was hearing those...that money for the State Fair, I had just been hearing, you know, this poverty thing that we needed to put some more money in, and I'm sorry, we don't have any more money, this event that we don't have any money for, things that really affected people's lives, and here we were devoting cash money
