of thing that says, you know, there are limitations on what the Legislature can do. There are limitations. And one of the limitations is that when you created a lottery and when you create that sum of money, there are limitations on what the Legislature can do with the money and we're going to put them in the constitution. Those are done up and down, right and left in our constitution. Read it for yourself. It's not as bland as Senator Chambers would have you believe, and this is pretty par for the course for a constitution. It is, however, I think with significance. Understand that what we're saying here is that the lottery shall be appropriated for the following purposes and it enumerates what those purposes are. And to me, you would have to ultimately trust the court for the meaning of that language as you have to trust the court with all interpretations of statutes and constitutions. However, when you have enumerated purposes, the Legislature cannot go beyond those enumerated purposes for anything other than a diluted, insane Supreme Court, which at various times in various states we probably have. But I trust at least with the present court not to do that. We're enunciating what those purposes are, and although the Legislature would...

First I want to thank Senator Landis for bringing the bill and Senator Cudaback for prioritizing it because I think it's very important that we have a discussion on the issue of the State Fair. I, myself, am very supportive of the State Fair. I think it's a grand tradition. I think it's a tradition that we need to promote and I think that's one of the problems that we have had and it's been brought out this afternoon, that I don't believe that our state has ever adequately funded the facilities of the fair or just actually some of the activities of the fair. And I admit, I think that we've been sort of lax
