to find out what would it take to bring people to the State Fair. The State Fair doesn't apparently exist for a program. The State Fair is trying to find a program that will be something that the people will want to come to. I don't think that that's necessarily perpetuating something that's of longstanding duration. I think it's trying to find itself. It has spent years trying to find itself, and so far it's continuing to look. Apparently the only thing that will save the State Fair, aside from an appropriation that the Appropriations Committee has tentatively made by a vote of 5 to 4 to continue a half a million dollars for prize money to entice the young people to come to the State Fair. So that's still up for grabs in my mind. But I think that we have an issue here as to whether we do have a statewide event. I don't think we do. I'd like...and many people think that we do have, and they would like to think that we do have. One of my very good friends is Senator Cudaback, and I know that this is a very important issue to him, and I empathize with that. I know that he would like it to be the way he remembers when he was young, not that he is older now, of course, but when he was even younger. But, anyway, it's the thing that he did enjoy doing, and I think that right now they've tried to go into electronics. They've tried to do all sorts of things that...excuse me, excuse me, could you all tone...Nancy, I am sorry, it's hard for me to hear; a little conversation going on right here. But, anyway, I think it's a matter that we need to be realistic about. I do think that it's something...we do have a statewide event in Nebraska, but you wouldn't know it. It's called Nebraskaland Days. Lincoln tried to do Nebraskaland Days initially. They couldn't get it done because they couldn't unify themselves, apparently, to come up with a program or the funds or the ambition to do it. It's in North Platte now. So it's a statewide celebration predominantly held by people in North Platte for the central part of the state. Some people do come to that. But these events are very, very hard to go. You have to have a real reason for them to exist. And, unfortunately, Senator Brashear says that this is a coming together of the people in the state. Well, the problem is they haven't been coming together. They haven't been coming to this event, so what we're trying to do now is we're trying to come up with money, taking it essentially from education and the environment, in order to fund something that will entice people
