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SENATOR ENGEL: Thank you, Senator Janssen. Senator Bromm.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you very much, Mr. President. And thank you, Senator Janssen, for giving me a moment. I just want to make a comment. The State Fair in Nebraska, in my view, has a great tradition, even though it hasn't been financially successful the last few years, as successful as we would like it. But I see things beginning to turn around a little bit. And if we can bring people together or find people to build the wonderful baseball facility that we have in this community, and if we can find people to donate \$40 million or \$50 million or whatever it is to build some better facilities for athletic department, no tax dollars, I've got to believe that there's a way to salvage the State Fair and do it in such a way that it becomes a great attraction. It needs not only support from us, at least, to provide a lifeline while it gets on its feet a little better, but it needs cooperation from other communities in the state. There should not be, as a state, major competing events scheduled during the State Fair. There should be cooperation from Omaha and other parts of the state for this event, as we try to salvage it, bring it around, and have it be something that we can all be proud of. Things are changing in all different ways. I mean, the traditional exhibits...

SENATOR ENGEL: One minute.

SPEAKER BROMM: ...that we've had there will not always be the kinds of exhibits that will...that people will focus on. But there may be some changes here. There may be technology competitions. There may be other types of events that will draw people in, that will make our State Fair something unique and something that once again lots of people will go and attend. I want to give it that chance. What better source than...put this up for people to register their opinion. Let them have a chance to vote on that. What's wrong with that? And if they support this and want to take some gambling money, I think, that's not taking it out of our General Fund, I think we ought to do it. Thank you. And if there's any time left, I'd certainly give it back if Senator Janssen wants it. If not, thank you, Mr. President.
