SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Hudkins.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That's what I would ask Senator Hudkins.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Hudkins, would you reply?

SENATOR HUDKINS: I'm sorry. I wasn't listening.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SENATOR HUDKINS: Could you repeat that?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: A person who already has a certificate or a diploma from the Law Enforcement Training Center is excused from having to file this letter saying that these various other things have taken place. Why was it decided to excuse a person who has a certificate or a diploma from having to do that?

SENATOR HUDKINS: The idea behind this, Senator Chambers, was that the candidate would already have gone through this when they...the background check and the educational test the first...when they went through the academy the first time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Suppose the certificate has been revoked. We wouldn't know that, would we?

SENATOR HUDKINS: We had another possibility for an amendment which we just ran out of time. And that would say, in line 5, any candidate for the office of sheriff who...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR HUDKINS: ...does not have a valid law enforcement. So if you want to do a quick floor amendment and stick that word in there, that would be fine.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: How would we know? Because if you ask the person and...all he'd have to do is lie. He'd say, yeah, mine is valid. There's no requirement that anybody check it. And I don't want to make you do anything that you don't feel
