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comfortable with. And I don't want to agree to something that may not adequately address what I'm interested in. But I did want to raise that issue. I don't see where it would be too inconvenient for a person, even if he or she has this certificate or the diploma, to simply get this letter. It's a standardized letter. So I would rather have all of them do it. But I'm not going to hold up the bill. But I won't vote for it, because sometimes when my innards told me, be cautious, I usually follow my innards, and they have not led me astray too often. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Hudkins.

SENATOR HUDKINS: Senator Chambers, to go back to what you were saying, your innards are probably correct on this, and it does make sense. It's amazing how we can read something 29 times and miss something that's obvious. But I would agree with you. Again, you have your little amendment pad, and you can write while I'm talking and put that in, and we would be more than happy to accept that they do have a certificate. You know what you said and how you would like to have it phrased. I would like to touch on just a little bit of what Senator Louden said. He said that we have very good sheriffs who have not had a background in law enforcement. That's fine. What we're trying to prevent is electing someone who does not have a background or...well no, let me back up. Yes, maybe they don't have a background, and yes, they would be a good sheriff. But even so, you don't have that many legal requirements to be a sheriff. If you want to be a county engineer, to be elected to that, one of the qualifications is that you have to be an engineer. If you want to be a county attorney, you can't just go down and file and hope that your friends will all vote for you. You have to be a county attorney. You do not have to know how to shoot a gun if you're a sheriff's candidate. You don't have to know how to drive a car. You don't know how to be...you don't have to be familiar with the law. But if you're going to be a sheriff, there are a number of things that you really should know how to do. And you're going to learn a lot of those. Sometimes being sheriff is a matter of a lot of common sense. But you are going to learn a lot of those things when you go to the training
