because he had his goal to do some work in his section of Omaha. Many of the other people on this floor helped take that money out of the cigarette tax for their own particular purpose, and one of those was the riverfront project, another one was to build a ditch through Lincoln, that they're now doing, and that's okay. Those same people didn't mind taking that out of there. They weren't worried...so much worried about education at that time, taking money out of the fund that was supposed to take care of some of the buildings the state has to maintain. It wasn't important at that time, but now it all of a sudden becomes more important. So again, I'm not being critical. I'm just merely stating the facts. When we transferred money out of those kind of funds for a purpose that seemed to be worthwhile, you know, it was okay. Nobody...I say nobody, a lot of us opposed it, but the majority won, and that's the way it should be. But I guess it's a little bothersome that now the same people who were so supportive of that are criticizing that they're trying to divert some money out of another fund, and so it's kind of...it's really kind of interesting to sit back and listen and watch. As I said, I know we all have our own agendas, and we should have, because that's why we're down here. But sometimes you get caught in your own trap, and I think that's happening at this present time, because some of the people who were supportive of taking that money now are very concerned about taking some money out of another fund to support something that some of us also feel is important, and that's the Nebraska State Fair and the continuance of it. So I'm not going to spend a lot of time being a critic, except just to explain the issue that I think is important. Also, I've been criticized by some in this body, and outside of this body, that I don't support gambling. I don't support the idea that we should have...that we should, in fact, let the people vote on a gambling bill. Some of them say that I haven't been fair because I wouldn't do that. Well, you know what? This is the same issue. We're only putting this on the ballot to decide if that's what the people want to do. So some of the people who have been so critical of my position should take a look at themselves, because now they're on the other side of the issue. They don't want...some of those same people who want to put in gambling don't...and say we're only putting on the ballot for the people to have a chance to vote on it, now don't want to do
