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morning? It does not rise to the level of morality. This is not a moral issue. Talking about the lottery might be. Did you say time, Mr. President?

SPEAKER BROMM: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Louden.

SENATOR LOUDEN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members of the body. I took the time to look up in the statutes about the State Fair and what it was all about, and we've been deliberating on this amendment deal and for two...couple of days or whatever time we've spent on it. And we've also been trying to, my observation, to micromanage the State Fair from the Legislature, sort of the same way we're trying to do with gambling. We're trying to micromanage instead of letting the people of the state work this out on themselves. And if you look in the statutes there, in 2-101, it says State Board of Agriculture meetings, State Fair and location. And it outlines what the state board of...what the state board is supposed to do. It's supposed to be the State Board of Agriculture is for the purpose of deliberating and consulting as to the wants, prospects, and conditions of the agriculture interests throughout the state. And then it goes on to say what...where the State Fair will be held and what can be done with it, and it says the State Fair shall be held at or near the city of Lincoln, in Lancaster County, under the direction and supervision of the State Board of Agriculture, it says, upon the site and tract of land selected and now owned by the state for that purpose, known as the State Fairgrounds. That's already all in statutes there. That can be changed without any trouble. And then at the end of that part it said, the board may, at its discretion, hold or dispense with the holding of the fair in any year. So the state board has control over what can be done with the fair. It's already in the statutes. Why are we working to try and get it in the constitution? We have some corrections should...could be done in the state statutes. I think...I think we're working at something that we don't need to work at, and I think we're in here trying to micromanage a State Fair. This could be done by
