What will be guaranteed is money going to the Nebraska State Fair Board. That is what will be guaranteed, nothing else. So why will none of you all do the hard work? Because you think I'll do it, don't you? You're counting on me to do it, aren't you? You can stand up here and play to your constituents about how you love the fair, but you won't do any of the work that is necessary to strip this down to what it really is about. Well, I'm not going to bail you out this time because it gives me a way to go after the budget, which I'm going to do. And don't think that it's going to be too difficult for me to do it. As the session goes on, I get stronger, my energy level rises. At the end of the day I'm running up those stairs and people are saying, you still got energy? Well, yeah, I'm supposed to have it, because I know the nature of my work and I know the nature of my responsibility, and I believe in the Boy Scout motto, be prepared, and I am prepared. You don't see me hiding in my office. I take an interest in almost everything that goes on, on this floor, and I'm not worn down and I'm not worn out and I'm not going to quit.
