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that causes the animal to behave in the way he does, after they have stuck those long poles into his neck and shoulder muscle so his head hangs down, always giving the advantage...

SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...to the human being, the human being who is supposed to be at the noble, lofty level, because the human being can think. The human being is the rational animal, but that rational part is always used to trick, to deceive those who are not too swift, to show cruelty to those who are weak and cannot defend and protect themselves. This is an act that is unforgivable because it is dishonest. It is fraudulent. It is a hoax. I would challenge Senator Landis...well, now I can't challenge him...Challenge "Emperor" Radcliffe and the chambers of commerce to give permission to let this thing say just what it's about--give 10 percent of the lottery funds to the State Fair Board. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Louden.

SENATOR LOUDEN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members of the body. On the subject of this amendment, FA1541, and the LR 209CA, I think we got to consider what our resources are and what we're going to do with that money, even if you did pass this amendment. You're talking about where we've cut funding for Medicaid and insurance to women and children and people that couldn't afford it on the low-income scale. We cut their money out from them and a lot of people were left without ways of paying for their medical assistance. So I think we have a certain amount of resources and we have to be very careful what we do them with. Are we...when we talk about using some of the state resources that we have for a State Fair for entertainment, is this really the way to go and is this really the Christian thing to do? There's a State Fair Board formed up. I think they need to have time to see if they're going to do something. When you look at this little booklet that was put out by the State Fair Board on some of these pages and they're telling about some of the steps they're going to take now where they've rearranged their work force and they're looking at different dates and a few things, why wasn't this done two or three years
