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ago? This thing has been in trouble for several years. This didn't just happen on our watch down here now. Why wasn't the questions being raised a few years back, and why were we waiting up until now to do something like this? And then all of a sudden we need a big shot of money from the lottery or someplace like that when the state really doesn't have the resources to take care of some of their healthcare plans. Also, there's money that has to be put out for our water policies that's going to need some work. There's a lot of things that we need to spend our money on, rather than spending it on helping the State Fair. There's other facilities in the area that are making their own way. There's...they have, what, a Horsemen's Park or something like that in Omaha. As far as I know, they're make...they're operating without state funding. If we do this, then are we going to have to come back in a few years and will Grand Island need some help with Husker Harvest Days? Up until now, I haven't heard of them asking for any money to help bail them out anyplace. They're operating the thing and making it work. Are we going to do the same thing with Kearney? Are they going to have to have some state lottery funds or whatever for their Cattlemen's Classic? And then whenever we do that, are we going to have to amend the constitution every time so we can put it in there that we're going to help these various areas? Part of it is all set up in statutes and I think we just as well continue working with our statutes like we always have. I don't know as amendment...as an amendment to the constitution is the way to go. I introduced an amendment to move the fair out to Mitchell, Nebraska. I think that's a good place to move it, out into the agricultural areas. I put it on this amendment because that's what was floating around and that was the idea. But I tell you, if there had been something to amend the statutes to do something like that, I would do it in an instant. I still think it's a better idea to move the thing out of Lincoln, use this property for something else besides for probably six weeks out of the year. This is valuable property sitting down there that the state owns. There's come a time when something else needs to be done with that property. There's value there. If it was put into some type of industrial area, I'm sure the tax revenue for the city of Lincoln would be considerably greater than what they seem to be thinking they're getting off the State Fair now, because evidently they don't believe they're getting
