SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR LOUDEN: ...the football team, but there's...the State Fair has been put in the background and I think it's time to think of it, do something else and come up with some original ideas on it. Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Louden. Senator Landis...excuse me, Senator Chambers, you're recognized to close on your amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, this amendment is to repeal the state lottery. If you're going to vote with Senator Landis and against money in the budget for the State Fair, vote against my amendment. If you want to handle this cleanly, just stop it here. I'm not going to presume anything about the vote on this amendment, nothing whatsoever. If it gets only my vote, I will not presume anything from that vote. It will just mean that what I've said earlier is true, that a lot of you have committed yourself to the "Emperor," and to the Lincoln Chamber of Commerce, and to their minions in the Legislature who are departing from the way they often do other things to do this thing for their city. I'm trying to present it in its starkest terms. I cannot predict what the vote will be when Senator Landis attempts to move the bill to Select File, but I can tell him one thing that I know for sure. There are people who have told you they'll give you a vote here who are not going to give you a vote on Select, because I've talked to some of them and I've asked them frankly, explain to me what you're doing, and they explain that they're not going to do it on Select File. But I tell them that's not good enough. You don't know what can happen between now and Final Reading, or when the session ends. But people can give that vote. Now, when the budget comes out here, you all will have forgotten what I said today, so I want to put it in your mind again and give Senator Maxwell something else to write about. If you all advance this bill, I'm going to do everything I can to strip any money out of the budget that goes to the
