SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: That is correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Schimek. In a way, I wish Senator Schimek well, because as you all know, I favor the women, I really do. I think they're better than men, and thank goodness they're here or none of us men would be here, who often do and say things that are hurtful to the ones who birthed us into the world.
