So I hope that we can have good debate on this, and whether or not the delays are taking place, I think it's important to take these one at a time: the number of casinos; how that affects urban areas compared to rural areas, assuming the casinos are good, the proponents, let's just assume, even though research would state otherwise. I think we have an issue on our hands that needs a full, fair discussion, and I believe we can make sure that that takes place here today. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Smith. Senator Louden.

SENATOR LOUDEN: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the body. I rise in objection to Senator Schimek's motion to overrule the Chair. I think she mentioned that it will probably be getting later, as people want to vote on it and we have to hurry through this, or something like this, and that isn't what it's all about. This is amending the constitution for...and so we certainly want to get this right. There's...it isn't a point of hurrying through this. It should be done, done correctly, and there's probably procedures that it needs to be done. Senator Beutler has mentioned that either vote it up or down or if we want to do something this afternoon, and there again, are you going to get it right or are we going to hurry through it just so we can get something done this afternoon? I guess when you've graduated from a parochial school, why, you come back to the thought that if you don't get your lessons right the first time, you stay in till you get it right, and that's what it looks like to me we're doing here. We're going to stay here till we get it right. And so I agree with the Chair that if...the first division isn't germane, so I certainly will agree with that. Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Louden. Senator Schimek has asked to be recognized.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you, Mr. President. I would like to withdraw my challenge to the Chair.
