SENATOR SMITH: I would ask for a roll call vote in reverse order, please.

SPEAKER BROMM: A roll call vote had been requested, but you have requested reverse order, so it will be in reverse order. Senator Landis, please return to the Chamber. All unexcused members are accounted for. Mr. Clerk, before proceeding with the vote, I'll explain to the members that the initial vote will be for cloture. If that vote is successful, we will then proceed to vote on the pending matters before us, which I will explain, which will first of all be the Schimek amendment in an undivided fashion, then the Smith amendment, AM2670, and then the advancement of the bill. The first vote is on cloture. Mr. Clerk, if you'd please call the roll in reverse order.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken, Legislative Journal page 928.)
32 ayes...Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Verification of the vote.

CLERK: (Record vote read, Legislative Journal page 928.)
32 ayes, 12 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to invoke cloture.

SPEAKER BROMM: Cloture is not successful. I raise the call. Mr. Clerk, do you have any items for the record?

CLERK: I do, Mr. President, thank you. Mr. President, some amendments to be printed: an amendment to LB 999 by Senator Beutler; Senator Beutler, an amendment to LB 962; Senator Baker to LB 559. And that's all that I have, Mr. President. (Legislative Journal pages 928-931.)

SPEAKER BROMM: LB 888...I mean...yes, I do. Mr. Clerk, LB 906.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 906 on Select File. The Enrollment and Review amendments have been adopted. Senator Jensen had pending an amendment that had been divided into several components, Mr. President. Senator Jensen, FA1472 and FA1473
