SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Johnson, would you yield?

SENATOR JOHNSON: I'll try.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Johnson, why is the term "medical purposes" included in this bill?

SENATOR JOHNSON: I'm afraid that I just walked into the room and so I...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: You don't know, in other words.

SENATOR JOHNSON: That's correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Members of the Legislature, I'm not going to support this amendment, and I'm not going to let this bill move today. I need to look at it. But before I definitely decide that, I want to ask Senator Stuhr a few more questions.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Stuhr.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Stuhr, the only thing I see in this bill that is made a crime is if a person...if a practitioner performs these activities on a person under the age of 18 without the permission and presence of that person's parent or guardian. Is there anything else in this bill that is made a crime?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Stuhr.

SENATOR STUHR: I do not believe so, Senator Chambers,...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But do you know?

SENATOR STUHR: ...as many times...as many times as I have read it. I know that there are certain standards for facilities, but at this time I do not believe so.
