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SENATOR STUHR: No, I don't...I don't think so.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Really, they can't do anything under the bill, can they?

SENATOR STUHR: Probably not.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Stuhr. Members of the Legislature, I'm not sure that there is anything in this bill. I haven't seen it, you know, I haven't examined it to be sure. But here is something to look at. These kids can do everything right now that you're saying you don't want done. They can do it in their fraternity houses, they can do it in grade school. Now some acts, if they're done to a child, might be found to be...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...child abuse or something. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Bourne, on AM2973. I'm sorry, Senator Stuhr's...think her light was first. I'm sorry, Senator Bourne.

SENATOR STUHR: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the body. Senator Chambers, just getting back to your question, I believe that would probably be true in anything, that if a private individual is doing something to another private individual, that that is pretty hard to regulate. I mean it's practically impossible. If a...let's say that someone wanted to pull your tooth and you allowed them to do that, they probably...you know, I mean we don't have any penalties for that if they...if they are not in the practice of being in that business as a licensed person. Senator Chambers, would you like to respond?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So...and I'm...I agree with you. That was
