SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR STUHR: ...18 years of age. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Stuhr. Senator Bourne, followed by Senator Chambers. Senator Bourne.

SENATOR BOURNE: Thank you, Mr. President, members. Senator Stuhr is right. We have been working on the bill. And I took a rough draft of it home this weekend and I looked at it and we...I guess a change has been made for clarity sake, and I'm trying to determine, just reading it right now, if it is substantive or not. And, Senator Stuhr, I just kind of want to establish with you a little bit what exactly we're talking about here, particularly on page 13. Would you yield to a question or two?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Stuhr, do you yield?

SENATOR STUHR: Yes, I will.

SENATOR BOURNE: And, Senator Stuhr, it's in Section 25, but on page 13. And again, this is...we had talked before we'd kind of establish a record of what, maybe provide some guidance to the Department of Health and Human Services as it relates to how much training, education, or experience is necessary. And again, I'm not trying to do anything other than establish a record of what exactly we intend in this legislation to mean by "education, training, or experience satisfactory to the department to ensure protection of the public." My intent in helping you draft this amendment is that the only thing that the department would look at is that individual's experience, training...or, excuse me, education, training, or experience is as it relates to sterilization techniques and infection control practices. Is that your understanding of subsection (d) on page 13 as well?

SENATOR STUHR: Yes, it is. The education, training, or experience satisfactory to the department to ensure protection
