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sanitation, and sterilization. It's whatever it takes...

SENATOR STUHR: No.

SENATOR BOURNE: ...to pass that test.

SENATOR STUHR: Exactly right, Senator Bourne. I think it's the minimum standard to ensure protection of the public,...

SENATOR BOURNE: Specifically...

SENATOR STUHR: ...if that's the point that...

SENATOR BOURNE: ...specifically as it relates to safety, sanitation, and sterilization.

SENATOR STUHR: Specifically as it relates to safety, sanitation, and sterilization...

SENATOR BOURNE: Okay.

SENATOR STUHR: ...and, as you look in part (e), the competency. I mean there are...there are...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR STUHR: ...there is one part of that.

SENATOR BOURNE: Thank you, Senator Stuhr.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, senators. Senator Chambers, and this will be your third time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, and I have an amendment I'm going to propose which will give us some additional time to examine this. I don't know...I'm going to go to where Senator Bourne was, because I thought he was going to get some answers that would alleviate my mind on this. I don't know why a person needs to have a high school diploma or equivalent education, but let me ask Senator Stuhr a question on that.
