SENATOR STUHR: And I...and I will repeat that I do appreciate...I have appreciated your help and support, because any time you do a new regulation in a profession that has not been done before, we do need to establish things on record in regards to the regulation and the licensing of such a profession. And again, we are doing this primarily, and I believe that is stated very well in Section 25,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR STUHR: ...for the protection of the public. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Stuhr. Senator Stuhr, there are no lights on. You're recognized to close on AM2973 to AM2963.

SENATOR STUHR: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the body. This particular amendment had to do with the age limit; that, "Nothing in this section shall be construed to require the performance of body art on a person under 18 years of age," and that was for the concerns for those practitioners that, even though we say that they have to be 18 years of age and accompanied with a parent, that they would still have the right to deny doing that particular practice.
