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filled up with open pickle cards. You've seen it. If you ever come to my area of the state and eat on a weekend, they're sitting there filled up. And probably for 10 or 20 bucks they're having a barrel of fun opening up their pickle cards, and it takes a long time, at 25 cents a hit, for fun and entertainment. Then I got to thinking, instead of hamburger baskets and just looking over there and seeing them ripped up tickets, I'm going to hear ding, ding, ding, ding, ding, ding, ding. Like Senator Redfield's article in the paper--ding, ding, ding, ding, ding, ding. And you know how fast you can go through 20 bucks in a slot machine? My little old buddies, instead of opening up pickle cards, are probably going to be ding, ding, ding, dinging it, and ding, ding, dining it to the tune of a lot of money. So instead of just a couple of remote cocaine dens they could drive several hundred miles to get to, we be going to have a cocaine den in every hamlet in the kingdom. And I hope that don't happen. I hope that we fight just as sincerely, those of us who were fighting yesterday and quoting me all those wonderful statistics, Dave, that you gave me and you're going to bring to my office, I hope you work just as hard between now and November to keep that from happening in my district. I don't want it. I don't want it. So now I'm not going to lay awake tonight because I bled. Thank you for teaching me how to speak. Even though it's not on this bill, I want to get it on the record as to how I feel about it, and what I want and what I don't want, and what I think my constituents want and don't want. And if my constituents are watching on TV, please do not vote for the amendments like you've told me that you're going to, unless we get something else out there to balance it out. Back to the tattooing, I still got some more time, huh? Still got some more time.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One and a half minutes.

SENATOR COMBS: Back to the tattooing, thank you, Senator Chambers, for your good eye. I am watching and I am learning and thanks for the good eye finding that tiny little word in however many pages of that bill it was, because that could be a big word just like Senator Johnson told us earlier on, in the earlier stage of debate, about the surgeons who do tattoo and the oncologists who do tattoo. Thank you.
