right now the language says on page 13: "Has submitted evidence of completion of education, training, or experience satisfactory to the department to ensure protection of the public," that could mean anything. What I was trying to do with Senator Stuhr yesterday afternoon is tie those three things--education, training or experience--into the next section, which talks about safety, sanitation and sterilization. Senator Chambers, would you yield to a question?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers, would you yield?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, I will.

SENATOR BOURNE: And, Senator Chambers, I wanted to ask you a couple questions about establishing a record. Can an individual other than the introducer of a bill, establish a record?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR BOURNE: Are you experienced in establishing records?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Quite.

SENATOR BOURNE: Have you been cited by the United States Supreme Court as establishing a record in various legislation?

SENATOR BOURNE: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Can you and I establish a record as it relates to this bill?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I didn't understand all that you said.

SENATOR BOURNE: Can you and I work together to establish a record to set forth the parameters by which this industry will be regulated?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: We can do that, but if there are specific areas in the bill that we can improve by amending while we're discussing it, I think we would have an obligation to offer the
