this was one of our concerns if we simply eliminated the procedure, all procedures, that would see more of this done, so to speak, underground. Thank you, and I turn the rest of my time back to the Chair.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Stuhr. On with discussion of the Chambers amendment FA1552 to AM2963. Senator Chambers, there are no further...there are now--yours. You may speak.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And mine is...my light is on for the purpose of withdrawing that amendment, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: It is withdrawn. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Stuhr would move to amend her amendment. (FA1553, Legislative Journal page 939.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Stuhr, you're recognized to open on your amendment to AM2963.

SENATOR STUHR: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the body. I do thank you for your patience, but I believe that we are working through this particular issue and that is found on page 13. What the amendment will do is, on (c) has a high school diploma or equivalent education, and we are substituting "or equivalent education" for a general education diploma. I think that makes a better clarification in that area. Also, we have struck lines 8 through 20, but are including the wording but just wording it in a different way which, I think Senator Chambers might agree and hopefully Senator Bourne, that is a little clearer in definition that the applicant has some...and this would be the new (d), "Has submitted evidence of training or experience prescribed or approved by the board to ensure the protection of the public," and again, this is the most important and I think key words, "in performing the practices of body art for which the applicant is seeking licensure." And as I have stated before, we are looking at four different areas which the applicant can make a license to become proficient. Then number (e), we will strike that section and we will then say: Has successfully completed an examination prescribed or approved, again, by the board, to test the applicant's knowledge
