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and with that I will turn my time back to the Chair.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Jensen, did you wish to have any more of the opening? He does not wish to utilize the rest of the five minutes. On with discussion of the amendment offered by Senator Jensen, AM2724, to LB 906. Senator Chambers, followed by Senator Beutler.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I didn't get a chance to hear what Senator Jensen said because I was working on something else, and I can't locate a copy of his amendment on my desk. But I had talked to Senator Cunningham about his amendment and expressed my objection to it. I do not think these interns should be doing what the bill would allow. And in order that I not misstate it, Senator Cunningham, when you said they on the basis of oral authorization can fill...refill prescriptions, is that what you said or you said something different?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Cunningham, will you yield?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, and I would like Senator Cunningham to respond.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Cunningham.

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: Yes, they're able to take oral authorization over the phone.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And who is providing this authorization?

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: It would be the person calling in for the prescription.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: How does the person...how does the intern verify that the one on the phone is the person whose prescription it is?

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: Well, Senator Chambers, this amendment doesn't change current statute at all. Currently, when someone calls in to the pharmacist, I guess there is no verification
