But we've spent all the time these last few days on LB 906 when it's been before us, talking about body art and tattooing; now we have some people who want to tattoo us with two unrelated proposals. One of them is being offered by a senator who cannot even answer a question without consulting with those who asked him to tattoo us with this bill. Senator Cunningham apparently thinks he can get the bill, his portion, adopted over my objection. We're not dealing with his bill. We're not dealing with Senator Byars' bill. We're dealing with Senator Stuhr's bill and some of us have worked very hard. Those who are attempting to clutter that bill did not spend time as we did when the bill was on the floor, when the bill was not before us, doing all of this work, having all these discussions. I'd like to ask Senator Jensen a question because he is the Chairperson of the Health and Welfare Comm...whatever they're called. I am going to get the name of the committee straight, first of all.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Jensen, would you yield to a question from Senator Chambers.

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Jensen, what is the name of your committee?

SENATOR JENSEN: Health and Human Services Committee.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Now why is the word "Human" in there?
